This summer program provides an introduction to audio engineering and will be led by Steve Taylor whose credits include a "Best of Philly" award from Philadelphia Magazine. He has performed on the same bill with artists such as Heart, Meatloaf, The Fabulous Thunderbirds and Taylor Dane just to name a few. He has attended The University of the Performing Arts audio engineering and recording program. He has also produced albums and countless demos for local area musicians.

Learning to setup a sound system and a live recording rig

If you want to learn how the pros setup a live recording rig here's your chance! For an entire week, each student will get hands on experience using professional audio engineering gear. Brian has been doing recording work for over 20 years and has produced albums and demos for dozens of local area bands. Each day, campers will learn the ins and outs of setting up a recording session and how to use the equipment to it's fullest potential. Topics to be covered are:

Components used in a recording rig

- Mixers, Equalizers, Aux section, Amplifiers, Speakers,
- Signal Processors, Input/Output components, Cabling

Sound system assembly

- Signal routing through the sound system
- Setting gains and levels at each stage

Different types of microphones

Microphone placement

How to work the mixing console

Overdubbing and "punching in"

Understanding the mix down

Knowledge of the mastering process

At the end of the workshop, campers will take a home a CD of the music they recorded.

Camp materials and snacks will be provided by the School.

A typical day's schedule:

9:30am-9:45am	Overview of the day's projects
9:45am-12:00pm	Setup and recording of multiple projects. Emphasis will be to get the projects to "tape". Each student will get to have the role of recording engineer
12:30pm-1pm	Lunch
1pm-3pm	Mixdown and mastering of projects. Students will work the mixing console and learn the various features of the digital mixing deck. They will then master their project and record it onto a CD. While this is going on other students will be learning how to operate the live sound equipment.
